Guidelines for Paper Contribution

The organizing team welcomes contribution in the form of well-researched papers related to the theme and sub-themes. Contributors are requested to follow the Guidelines given below;

Section I: Topic and an Abstract of about 100 words with 'Keywords'

Section II: About the Author(s): Bio-data (a brief resume of about 50 words), institutional affiliation, a recent passport-size photograph and the mailing address with mobile no. In case of more than one author, first author and/or communicating author should be clearly identified.

Section III: A signed declaration of originality and conformance to research ethics should accompany the paper, including the declaration that the paper has not been published elsewhere and has not been sent for publication anywhere else.

Section IV: Full paper

Normal page layout, Times New Roman Font with size 12, headings should be maximum of size 14 and single line spacing. All diagrams, charts and graphs should be referred to as Figures and consecutively numbered (Fig.1, Fig.2, and so on). Tables should carry only essential data and should complement the text.

They should carry a short title, be numbered (Table 1) and carry the source at the bottom. Each table must be referenced in the text.

The paper should have sub-headings to make it more reader-friendly.

For referencing, follow APA style.

While sending Abstracts, please include Sections I and II only and submit to *ic2018.gcit@rub.edu.bt* by 30th November 2018, with file name using Initials of the First Author (XXX) and Date of sending the Abstract (DDMMYY): ABSTRACT-XXX-DDMMYY.doc

After double-blind review, communication of acceptance of Abstract shall be completed within 5th December 2018.

Full-papers should be submitted to *ic2018.gcit@rub.edu.bt* containing all the Sections I, II, III and IV by 10th January 2019.

After double-blind review, communication of acceptance of Full paper shall be completed within 20th January 2019.

Registration of all the authors whose papers are accepted should be completed by ${\bf 15}^{\rm th}$ February 2019.
